## 2. Graduate profile and learning objectives

a) The institution defines the learning objectives of the study programme such as student's abilities at the time of completion of the programme and the main learning outcomes<sup>7</sup>.

Jessenius Faculty of Medicine in Martin, Comenius University in Bratislava (JFM CU), is an institution whose one of its tasks is to educate physicians capable of providing health care to citizens at the level of up-to-date knowledge. Based on this task, our goal is to prepare graduates who have the following qualification characteristics:

- The graduate of JFM CU masters the basic principles of medicine and is able to apply these in their profession. He is generally educated and well-trained so that he is able to understand the existence and importance of the relationship between medicine, nature sciences and society and is able to use this knowledge in his/her work.
- The graduate has theoretical knowledge of the morphology and function of individual organs and systems of a healthy person, the origin and course of morphological and functional changes that will enable their correct interpretation and application for rational health promotion, prevention, diagnosis and treatment of diseases.
- The graduate masters basic methods of medical examination using simple instrumentation and basic laboratory and examination methods, including diagnostics, differential diagnosis and treatment of more common diseases. He/she also masters the basics of providing qualified assistance in life-threatening situations.
- The graduate has good theoretical and practical clinical skills which, under the professional guidance of an experienced physician, will enable him/her to provide healthcare at the appropriate level of the organizational structure.
- By studying at JFM CU, the graduate acquires the ability and willingness to continue their education.
- The graduate understands human health and disease as a result of the interaction of genetic, biological, physical, chemical, psychological, emotional, spiritual, social and other environmental influences on the human body.
- The graduate should be a convinced supporter of modern trends in the development of medicine, represented mainly by the concepts of primary disease prevention and health promotion with an emphasis on the preference for a healthy lifestyle.
- The graduate should be a bearer of basic human principles and should cultivate and maintain a sense of a hierarchy of values in which altruism, empathy, respect for life, respect for human dignity and the rights of the patient are at the forefront.
- The graduate masters the principles of medical psychology and ethics, which will be guided in his/her professional activities in relation to the sick person, his/her relatives and his/her surroundings.
- The graduate will also be prepared to work in primary health care. He/she masters the basic principles and organization of health care, basic medical legal standards necessary for the exercise of the profession.
- The graduate will be able to obtain a specialization in individual medical disciplines or be able to be actively involved in medical research after completing the prescribed internships, postgraduate studies and examinations.
- The graduate masters basics of scientific work in theoretical and clinical disciplines and modern methods of obtaining scientific and professional information.

The content of the study program is in accordance with the Regulation of the Government of the Slovak Republic No. 296/2010 to acquire professional competence for the category of medical doctor in the range of at least 5500 hours of theoretical and practical teaching. The required level of his/her skills and knowledge is in accordance with Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council No. 2005/36/EC on the recognition of professional qualifications.

b) The institution indicates the professions for which the graduate is prepared at the time of completion and the potential of the study programme from the point of view of graduate's employability.

By completing the study program, the graduate acquires professional competence for the performance of the profession of general practitioner as well as for further specialization and certification studies. Graduates are qualified to work and research in this field and to continue in their education throughout their lives. Graduates have the ability to manage and provide preventive, supportive, curative, rehabilitative care to patients in the full range of diseases. They master the basics of scientific work, methods of obtaining scientific and professional information and are ready to continue their doctoral (post-graduate) studies. Graduates of the study program of general medicine at JFM CU are employed not only in the Slovak Republic, but also in other countries of the European area and outside the EU.

## 3. Employability

a) Evaluation of the study programme graduates employability.

Pursuant to Section 68 of the Act on Higher Education Institutions (131/2002), JFM CU issues documents on the completion of a study program. Evidence of the necessary qualifications for the exercise of the profession and the acquisition of the relevant academic degree are a university diploma, a diploma supplement and a state examination certificate. Evidence of completion of studies is issued within 45 days of the proper completion of studies, usually at the graduation ceremony, unless the graduate agrees to the later issuance of documents no later than on the day of fulfilment of the last condition for graduation.

The study program general medicine at JFM CU is implemented in accordance with the relevant provisions of Government Regulation 296/2010 on professional competence to perform the medical profession, the method of further education of medical staff, the system of specialized disciplines and the system of certified work activities.

Theoretical and practical knowledge gained during the study of general medicine allows graduates to master the principles of medicine and apply them in their profession. The graduate of the study program is generally educated and able to integrate theoretical knowledge from medical disciplines with other biomedical and social sciences, to transform them into a holistic approach in the practice of the medical doctor/physician. The study program ensures high-quality employment of graduates at home and abroad.

#### 4. Structure and content of the study programme<sup>9</sup>

a) *The institution describes the rules for the design of study plans within the study programme.*

The study program takes into account the mission, but also the goals set by Jessenius Faculty of Medicine Comenius University (JFM CU) in the field of science and research (from page 9 in the Long-term plan of JFM CU) and in the field of education (from page 5 in the long-term plan of JFM CU). The study program was created and innovated in the intentions of the development trends of this kind of programs in Europe and in the world, taking into account the attractiveness for high school students.

The study program was created in accordance with the needs of practice; therefore, one of the main aspects in the design of subjects was the aspect of applicability of knowledge and competencies in real practice.

In terms of strategic goals in the field of international activities (page 12 of the plan), the program and its study plan were designed so that students can complete part of their studies abroad while studying this study program, in which the faculty has extensive experience and a wide network of partner universities with related study programs for the submitted study program.

In accordance with the Dublin descriptors and at the same time in accordance with the national qualification framework, the graduates of the SP will obtain the 7th level of qualification (SKKR 7) - <https://www.kvalifikacie.sk/katalog-skk/>.

The recommended study plan (SP; [see appendix](#)) was prepared and approved within the Study Program Board, while the guarantors of individual courses, employers and students also commented on it. The proposal is in accordance with Decree No. 614/2002 Coll. on the study credit system and Act No. 131/2002 Coll. on Higher Education Institutions and on Amendments to Certain Acts.

c) *The study plan generally states:*

- *individual parts of the study programme (modules, courses, and other relevant school and extracurricular activities, if they contribute to the achievement of the required learning outcomes and allow to obtain credits) in the structure of compulsory, compulsory optional and optional courses,*

The study program is designed so that it consists of a range of compulsory courses (CC), compulsory optional courses (COC) and optional courses (OC). Profile courses are included among the compulsory courses in this study program. COC and OC allow students to get acquainted with various areas of health care during the undergraduate study, which can help them to further choose their professional career after graduation. Each course is assigned a number of credits, which corresponds to the workload (approximately 26 hours of study and self-study - 1 credit). Some compulsory and elective courses are considered to be follow-up, i.e. their enrolment in the study plan requires prior successful completion of the prerequisite course (see the Study Regulations of JFM CU, IR JFM CU No. 13/2020)

Individual courses are gradually included in the group of basic medical disciplines, pre-clinical disciplines and clinical disciplines. Integral part of clinical disciplines is represented by a completion of summer practice (internal diseases, surgery, paediatrics, gynaecology and obstetrics, general medicine).

The student's workload (extent of teaching) for individual subjects and semesters is specified in the recommended study plan and is adjusted so that the workload is as balanced as possible throughout the study.

Credits are allocated to individual subjects based on the achieved learning outcomes and related workload within the study and self-study (approximately 26 hours per credit) and are part of the recommended study plan.

During the teaching part of individual semesters, students complete a total of 1,652 hours of lectures, 2,457 hours of seminars, practical exercises and clinical internships. In addition, they complete 1,782 hours of contact clinical practice in a medical facility as part of summer internships and pre-state internships. The total number of contact hours is 5,891 for the entire period of study (6 years). The estimated average time of self-study is 4,000 hours (it varies based on the individual abilities of individual students and includes preparation for regular weekly classes as well as for continuous and final assessment of subjects and state exams).

d) *The institution states the number of credits, the achievement of which is a condition for proper completion of studies and other requirements that the student must meet within the study programme and for its proper completion, including the requirements for state examinations, rules for re-study and rules for the extension, interruption of study.*

The minimum amount of credits for the entire study that the student must obtain for its successful completion is 360 credits. The amount of credits for state exams is as follows: 4 credits for Diploma Thesis Defence and another 20 credits for other state exams, consisting of profile courses (compulsory courses Internal Medicine, Surgery, Gynecology and Obstetrics, Pediatrics). The courses of the state exams are part of the study plan and the credits obtained for these subjects are added to the student only after their successful completion.

Control stages and rules of study:

- at the end of the first semester obtaining at least 15 credits for successfully completed courses,
- obtaining the minimum number of credits at the end of the study year:
  - first year of study: 40 credits,
  - second year of study: 90 credits,

- third year of study: 135 credits,
- fourth year of study: 180 credits,
- fifth year of study: 225 credits,
- sixth year of study: 270 credits,
- seventh year of study: 315 credits
- eighth year of study: 360 credits

- student can obtain a maximum of 90 credits per academic year,

The state examination is public and takes place in front of the examination commission in the period specified in the study schedule and in the schedule for the 6th year. The state exam is graded with grades A to FX. The examination commission decides on the success of state examinations in a closed session on the day of its holding. The student is entitled to two corrective dates of the state examination in the corrective periods in the relevant academic year or in the following academic years, while the total period of study of the study program may not exceed eight years.

f) *The institution describes the rules for verification of learning outcomes, students assessment and the possibilities of appealing against the assessment.*

The individual methods of evaluation of study results are designed to clearly determine and verify the required conditions for passing the course. The student is acquainted in time with the dates of regular and corrective possibilities of continuous assessment and with regular and corrective dates of exams. Every student has the right to be informed about the evaluation of all parts of the continuous assessment and examination. The student has the right not to accept the evaluation on the exam date and to register for the relevant corrective exam date. If a student has been assessed with the FX grade at the regular exam date or has not applied for one of the regular exam dates in time, he / she is entitled to two corrective exam dates. The student has the right to request the completion of any exam date by a "commission form" of examination. The Dean, on the proposal of the person with the main responsibility for the implementation, development and quality assurance of the study program, appoints at least a three-member examination commission; the chairman of the examination commission is usually the teacher of the given subject. The commission form of the examination can take place without the student's request, if requested by the subject teacher. Details are regulated by the study regulations of the faculty in Art. 11 Evaluation of study results (IR JFM CU No. 13/2020).

The student may apply for review of the decision on expulsion from the study. The Dean may grant the request or forward the request within 15 days from the date of its delivery to the Rector, together with the attached file material and a written opinion on the applicant's statements and objections. At the written request of the student, the Dean may grant an exemption from the terms of the faculty study schedule, from the control stages of the study, from the maximum length of study interruption, allow the study to be interrupted if the student does not meet the conditions of the control phase or waive. g) *Conditions for recognition of studies or a part of studies.*

Study programs (SP) are designed in accordance with ECTS transfers and credit recognition, while it is a priority for SP graduates to acquire knowledge and new skills also through mobility at domestic and foreign institutions. The specific requirements for completing a mobility are regulated by the study plan. The mobility is implemented within a wide range of publicly available schemes (ERASMUS +, SAIA, etc.).

Recognition of the completion of the course is the awarding of the assessment of the course and the subsequent acquisition of the appropriate number of credits that are assigned to the course, based on the part of the study completed in the past. A student who has studied at a university in the past and his studies have not been properly completed, a student applying for a transfer and a student applying for a change of study program within the Comenius University can apply for recognition of courses if they meet the conditions set by the JFM CU study regulations. Among other things, they include not exceeding 5 years from the award of the subject evaluation during the unsuccessfully completed study, and obtaining an evaluation in the range of A, B or C. The student must apply for recognition of the completion of courses in writing before the beginning of the teaching part of the relevant semester of the academic year in which the course is taught. The dean decides on the recognition of the completion of the subjects after the opinion of the responsible teachers of the subjects for which the student requests the recognition of the completion. Details on the recognition of subjects from previous unfinished studies (or when transferring or changing the study program) are set out in the study regulations of JFM CU (IR JFM CU No. 13/2020).

Credit transfer is the process of counting credits obtained within a part of study at another university in the Slovak Republic or at a university abroad in the number of calculated student credits according to § 4 par. 3 of the Decree on the Study Credit System. Academic mobility is formally conditioned by a study contract between the student, the CU and the host university. The study contract contains in particular the proposed study plan at the host university and the recognition of the corresponding part of the study at JFM CU. The courses that the student has to complete at the receiving university on the basis of a study contract become a valid part of the student's study plan. Courses completed at the receiving university within the framework of academic mobility are recognized by the faculty to the student on the basis of a statement of study results prepared by the receiving university at the end of his / her studies. The list of study results becomes part of the student's personal study documentation kept by the faculty. Details on the recognition of courses in academic mobility are set out in the study regulations of JFM CU (IR JFM CU No. 13/2020).

## 8. Spatial, material, and technical provision of the study programme and support

- a) List and characteristics of the study programme classrooms and their technical equipment with the assignment to learning outcomes and courses (laboratories, design and art studios, studios, workshops, interpreting booths, clinics, priest seminaries, science and technology parks, technology incubators, school enterprises, practice centres, training schools, classroom-training facilities, sports halls, swimming pools, sports grounds).

All JFM CU facilities are well-arranged for high-quality teaching-learning process as well as for conducting scientific research activities. A significant stimulus for the modernization of the existing JFM CU infrastructure was the successful implementation of projects co-financed by the Structural Funds. All theoretical (basic sciences), preclinical, and clinical workplaces have modern instrumentation, technical and material equipment. The accessible infrastructure makes it possible to obtain original results and provide modern educational, as well as scientific research activities for students and academic staff. Well-equipped JFM CU infrastructure include, among others, modern communication technologies, audiovisual devices, and *didactic equipment for learning*. JFM CU continues to develop IT technology by ensuring the widespread availability of the Internet for students and building a system of videoconferencing with the possibility of demonstrating medical interventions, including real-time surgery. In addition, specialized classrooms are furnished with education materials and accessories.

**Facilities and workplaces related to study program:** Educational and scientific research activities are carried out in the following medical facilities: Malá Hora 4, Malá Hora 4B, Malá Hora 4C, Malá Hora 4D and Malá Hora 5, Biomedical Centre Martin (BioMed Martin) and Facilities for non-medical study programs (Midwifery, Public Health, and Nursing). Clinical subjects and practice are dominantly provided in the University Hospital Martin. The majority of the Faculty facilities are located within the area of Malá Hora. This integral complex of facilities provide wide spectrum of opportunities for both educational a research activities and interdisciplinary cooperation. Educational activities and scientific sessions at JFM CU take place at following locations: two lecture halls nearby the student dormitory, lecture hall at Mala Hora 4, lecture hall at Mala Hora 5, lecture hall in the Education Center in Mala Hora 4B, and two lecture halls at the University Martin Hospital. Since 2010, JFM CU also has its own modern hall with a capacity of 476 seats. In addition, modern interactive education is provided and supported by Academic Information Center (since 2012) which also includes the Simulation Learning Center (currently called the Medical Education Support Center). This workplace is currently significantly expanded and strengthens its equipment, as well as staff capacity to ensure the teaching and training of skills. b) Characteristics of the study programme information management (access to study literature according to Course information sheets, access to information databases and other information sources, information technologies, etc.).

**Information delivery (library and information services) and access to study literature:** The Academic Library and Audiovisual Center of JFM CU is a scientific-information, bibliographic, coordination and counseling workplace. The library provides library-related service in all study programs. Through its activities, it provides support for studies and education at the faculty, as well as scientific research activities. It provides services in accordance with the Library and Lending Regulations of the Library. It also follows the methodological guidelines and instructions of the Academic Library of Comenius University (CU), the instructions and methodologies of the Center for Scientific and Technical Information of the Slovak Republic, and internal regulations of the JFM CU dean. As part of the information provision of study fields, it provides students with library and information services in order to meet the educational, scientific-research, social and cultural needs of:

- Lending services - attendance and interlibrary services
- Access to the online catalog - building and access to the comprehensive online catalog of the CU. Access to the library collection is via the CU online catalog and via the JFM CU library website: <http://alis.uniba.sk:8088/search/query?locale=en&theme=Katalog>
- Access to compulsory and recommended literature - compulsory and recommended literature is updated annually on the basis of documents from JFM CU teaching staff and information sheets of individual subjects: <https://www.ifmed.uniba.sk/en/departments/information-workplaces/kniznica/obligatory-and-recommended-study-literature/>
- Special services - search services from own library funds
- Purchase of a library fund (acquisition) - special attention is paid to supplementing the basic and recommended study literature. The active participation of users is also used and, based on their proposals, the purchase of professional medical literature is carried out. The JFM CU fund consists of specialized medical literature for the study programs: general medicine, dentistry and non-medical study program. The fund consists of sets of scientific medical material (scientific journals, books, textbooks, etc.)
- Bibliographic registration and storage of PhD. and diploma theses - access to information
- Publication database - access to the online catalog of publication activities: <http://alis.uniba.sk:9909/search/query?locale=en&theme=EPC>. Publishing activity is registered online through a nationwide database CREPČ2 (central register of publication evidence). The CREPČ2 database records bibliographic records such as publications and citations. The database allows independence from library formats, social rights and rules for users, as well as internal control in the creation of entities and records at all universities in Slovakia. At present, the academic library provides access to the information provision of study programs on the basis of library and information processes, which are fully automated through the VIRTUA library information system and the CREPČ2 register.

**Access to information databases and other information resources:** The Academic Library provides access to licensed electronic information resources (EIR) which are made available within the NISPEZ project. Access to EIR is possible via computers connected to the JFM CU network or via remote access to CU information resources also from computers connected outside the CU network. Faculty library offers the services of a digital study room, which is equipped with computers with internet access, access to CU catalogs, and electronic information sources. Students have access to the study rooms daily and on weekends and public holidays from 7.00 am until 10.00 pm. Thanks to Office365 account, students and teachers have an opportunity to download and use supplement services of Microsoft, such as download and install the Office package. The address and mailbox will remain with them even after the end of employment or study. The official e-mail communication of the university, messages from the AIS system or from the university's e-learning system are delivered to this mailbox. Automatic and optimized mailing lists and groups are created for the purpose of mass mailing to department heads, teachers, researchers, PhD students and students. In addition to e-mail, other services are available that simplify document handling and support group collaboration such as SharePoint for file sharing within the UC, OneDrive - 5TB document cloud storage per user, MS Teams for distance learning and online communication, Office 365 online (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Access, etc.), and Office 365 offline.

c) Characteristics and extent of distance education applied in the study programme with the assignment to courses. Access, manuals of e-learning portals. Procedures for the transition from contact teaching to distance learning.

JFM CU has been paying special attention to the issue of e-learning for a long time. During the COVID-19 pandemic the teaching has been delivered remotely. The activities of the JFM CU in the field of e-learning are divided into the following areas:

- Electronic creation and distribution of teaching materials

**Videoconferencing systems** are used for online live transmissions of surgeries to the auditorium for students, physicians and PhD students within the e-learning education system. The use of videoconferencing equipment enables the online transmission of demanding surgical interventions to the premises where professional events and teaching take place. The faculty also has a new Cisco Telepresence facility. These devices are used not only for e-learning, but also for the transmission of training and video conferencing meetings with the CU management. The transfer of training and meetings has a direct economic benefit in reducing the need to traveling to Bratislava. The videoconferencing system was expanded with a new state-of-the-art TP20 Cisco IX5000 device at the JFM CU Dean's Office. Telepresence room serves for effective and multipurpose communication <https://www.tp.cvtisr.sk/>. It is also used for online transmissions of trainings and meetings from rectorate of CU in Bratislava and for connections via other video conferencing programs - such as a display unit for Skype, Google Meet, Zoom, Microsoft Teams and others - thus providing comfortable communication thanks to three large screens. It also proved successful in connections within domestic and international scientific conferences and especially in state examinations carried out in the distance form, which had to be carried out in connection with security measures associated with the worsened epidemiological situation (coronavirus COVID-19). All videoconferencing facilities are used to increase the quality of education, intensify national and international

cooperation and communication with the world, online mediation of conferences, special diagnostic and therapeutic procedures with the possibility of consultations. The faculty also has a unique 3D video conferencing system.

**Distance education** (including distance exams) is implemented at the faculty mainly through the Microsoft Teams program. In cooperation with CU, a manual was developed, which is published on the faculty website <https://www.ifmed.uniba.sk/en/departments/information-workplaces/department-of-information-technology/it-services/online-komunikacia>. Department of information technology provide 24/7 technical support. Distance learning is constantly being improved and enriched with new elements by connecting software and hardware (connecting an electron microscope or ultrasound to live online learning via Microsoft Teams). We also use the above technique in the organization of webinars <https://webinarjlfuk.sk>. To improve distance learning, the faculty also uses a digitization. This offers the ability to digitize existing X-rays and other medical images into the full medical DICOM format, and subsequent processing on the HIPAX desktop system. Digitized images are stored on an external medium, burned to a CD / DVD, or transferred to another PACS system. In addition, the faculty has the possibility of large format printing and scanning - printing posters in high quality in A0 format. The faculty has at its disposal a high-capacity device (Book Digitizer and Script ScanRobot TREVENTUS) enabling digitization of books and scripts in cooperation with OCR software and publishing on the web using FlipViewer Xpress Creator. At present, narrow-profile publications, which are of the greatest interest among students in the library, are being digitized. The Electronic Books Portal system and Adobe Connect are intended for the distribution of digitized materials.

**E-learning web portals:** The Faculty is a founding member of the MEFANET network (association of Czech and other Slovak medical faculties <https://www.mefanet.cz/index-en.php>). The MEFANET portal at the JFM CU has more than 2,450 registered users and contains more than 445 medical articles. The faculty portal <https://portal.ifmed.uniba.sk/index-en.php> is integrated into the MEFANET system. The content of the pedagogical works is published in a form that corresponds to the scripts published in print (most often in PDF format). Works recognized by the editorial board of JFM CU are marked with the logo on the portal. Furthermore, the content of the portal includes multimedia teaching aids, which are either physically located on the JFM CU portal, or there is a link to them. Teachers can also make sound lectures available to their students <https://portal.ifmed.uniba.sk/index-en.php>. The pedagogical staff and students of the faculty use the e-learning server MOODLE to create e-learning courses and online testing. Some e-learning courses are used for electronic online testing of students, but there are also comprehensive courses that students can use for self-study. For users of e-learning systems, the e-learning portal JFM CU was created - <https://e-learning.ifmed.uniba.sk/en-index.php>, which contains, among other things, manuals for individual e-learning web portals. To support teaching, various teaching websites, portals, web multimedia textbooks, e-books are also being created at our faculty. The above services are concentrated and available from the unified distance education portal. The portal is divided into six sections: e-learning, e-testing, external information sources, online communication, publishing platforms, online simulation simulators and virtual patients. Each of these sections contains a list of available software, a brief description of what each software allows, available links, manuals, tutorials, FAQs and, of course, the contact person to support the software.

e) Characteristics of the possibilities for social, sports, cultural, spiritual and social activities.

The Faculty offers a wide range of activities and services to students. The Faculty runs two student residences with the capacity of 958 beds. The residence on L. Novomeského street (capacity 781 beds) and the residence on P. O. Hviezdoslavova street (capacity 177 beds) offer accommodation in the style of hotel rooms (double and triple occupancy), apartments and en-suite apartments. All rooms are furnished and have access to Wifi. Both residences also offer laundry facilities and secure bike lockers.

There are two parking slots on the compound of L. Novomeského and, nearby, there is a [student library](#) with fully equipped study rooms. Within this residence, there are also two table tennis game rooms, two fitness rooms and two leisure rooms. Outside, there is a sport complex with a running track, a football pitch and tennis courts. The canteen at the L. Novomeského is operational throughout the day, offering breakfasts, lunches and dinners to staff and students. The canteen offers a reduced service during the summer and exam period months. This residence also has a chapel. A piano room and a special room for editors of student journal Omphalus Martinensis are available. The JFM CU [Institute of Physical education](#) is nearby both residences and further offers sport and wellness/spa facilities.

JFM CU students are also organized in groups such as the [Martin Medical Club](#), that covers a range of activities in specialisms such as public health, development of medical science, scientific and research activities but also looks at areas such as human rights.

Group and charitable events such as the Festival of Medics, The Medics run, ice-hockey tournament called the Martin Stethoscope, MedGames and many more are organized by students every year.

Students also take part in international events and competitions and sit on the councils and boards of national and international organizations such as the National Association of Medical Students, The Slovakian Union of Dentistry Students and the International Federation of Medical Students.

f) Possibilities and conditions for participation of the study programme students in mobilities and internships (indicating contact details), application instructions, rules for recognition of this education.

The Faculty is involved in the Erasmus + initiative and offers the following mobility programs:

Erasmus + student mobility – available to all students across the general medicine and nursing study programs. This type of mobility is based on an inter-institutional agreement with [partner universities](#) and the length of stay is between a minimum of three and a maximum of 12 months. Various conditions are attached to student mobility, including:

- Students are unable to interrupt their studies during their Erasmus stay
- Students must complete and agree a Learning agreement with their home and hosting university
- Students can only apply for Erasmus places with universities that have inter-institutional agreement with JFM CU.

The application process for the Erasmus + student mobility is open twice a year and is submitted via the Mobility Online platform.

#### Conditions for being accepted on the programs.

#### Recognition of completed subjects and credits.

Recognition of subjects and credits follows the terms set in the internal document, article 19

#### Student mobility for Traineeship

Students can join the traineeship mobility at any state of their studies [BA, MA or PhD level] for a minimum of two and a maximum of 12 months. With this type of mobility, the onus on student to find a suitable placement and secure a place. If the content of placement is aligned with the student's study plan, it will be automatically recognized and added to the Diploma supplement document.

#### Application process

The JFM CU Erasmus Office will announce the start date for submitting the applications. The applications are submitted via the Mobility Online platform and can be submitted throughout the year. Students can submit their application as soon as their placement at the hosting institution is confirmed.

#### Erasmus + mobility for graduates

JFM CU students can also apply for Erasmus + mobility for graduates, once they have completed their studies. This type of mobility is financed by the EU from Erasmus + program grants and lasts a minimum of two and a maximum of 12 months. This mobility is delivered in partnership with WorkSpace Europe ([www.workspaceeurope.sk](http://www.workspaceeurope.sk)) and can be completed within the 12 month-period after graduating.

#### Conditions and criteria for being accepted to study at JFM CU

To be able to study the joint study program (I. and II. levels) at JFM CU, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- To have achieved a suitable level school leaving qualification that enables students to study at university and to be able to provide a medical certificate of fitness that confirms the student's ability to study at a university level.
- To sit and pass the admission exam. Students must achieve a set number of points that will put them in the league table of students for admission.

The Academic Senate is the body that, in line with the legislation [and internal regulations](#), considers and approves the criteria for admission. Further conditions that regulate the admission process for the joint and the second cycles study programs for 2022/23 academic year can be found [here](#). Information for application is published in the [admission](#) section of JFM CU website.

#### 9. Required abilities and admission requirements for the study programme applicants

a) Required abilities and necessary admission requirements.

Information about the admission process approved by the JFM CU Academic Senate are published in the [Applicants](#) section of the website. With close alignment to [the admission exam internal regulations UK no. 4/2021](#) - the Academic Senate reviews the admission conditions and process on a yearly basis.

b) Admission procedures.

Information about the admission process approved by the JFM CU Academic Senate are published in the [Applicants](#) (international students) and <https://www.ifmed.uniba.sk/studium/uchadzaci/> (Slovak students) section of the website. With close alignment to [the admission exam internal regulations UK no. 4/2021](#) - the Academic Senate reviews the admission conditions and process on a yearly basis. The admission assessment consists of online written exam from biology and chemistry. The exam is made up of 40 biology and 40 chemistry multiple-choice questions with only one correct answer. It takes 80 minutes to complete. Every correct answer is worth one point. Points are not deducted for incorrect answers. The technical side of delivery of the online exam is supported by the company SCIO. Unsuccessful candidates can request to view their test and appeal against the decision of no place offer. The appeal process is governed by internal regulation [UK no. 4/2021](#).

#### 10. Feedback on the quality of provided education

a) Procedures for monitoring and evaluating students' opinions on the study programme quality.

The quality of teaching is assessed every year – in line with paragraph no. 131/2002. – The assessment methods include:

- Assessment at the teaching unit in the form of feedback (student questionnaire) collected the head of the clinic/department

- Students can also submit their feedback, comments and recommendations directly to Vice-Dean via the online form or printed sheets located at the various points around the Faculty.

The student feedback is processed at regular intervals and discussed at various management and committee meetings.

b) Results of student feedback and related measures to improve the study programme quality.

The student feedback results – the assessment of teachers and subjects – are collated after each semester and the summarized report is shared with every head of the clinic/department and/or the subject guarantor with the view to incorporate the comment into improving the quality of teaching and subjects.

The feedback (qualitative data and indicators) are also published online.

c) Results of graduate feedback and related measures to improve the study programme quality.

As part of measuring the quality teaching, the faculty also collects graduate feedback once a year through an electronically distributed questionnaire. After summarizing the results and comments, they discussed at the Study Program Board and management level.
