The student is informed about the method, scope and content of evaluation of individual assignments and activities forming the concept of the subject at the beginning of the semester. Different methods (full-time, distance and/or hybrid) can be appropriately combined in teaching and assessment, which ensures a variety of approaches to achieving learning objectives, taking into account the needs of stakeholders. The JFM CU actively approaches the support of access to education for students with special needs (Directive of the Rector of Comenius University on ensuring a generally accessible academic environment for students with special needs (IR CU No. 23/2014; IR CU 23/2021). They have at their disposal a Support Center for Students with Special Needs of Comenius University, in which the faculty is also represented through its coordinator.

These courses also include lectures aimed at adhering to academic ethics when writing scientific publications and other outputs, including the final thesis.
