Graduates of Nursing Education Program are capable to meet the requirements of the nursing science that integrates scientific knowledge of nursing with scientific findings of other disciplines, which are necessary for providing health-care services to the public in the form of primary, secondary and tertiary prevention.

The goal of JFMED is to provide the graduates of Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program with following knowledge, capabilities and competencies:

To possess sufficient knowledge of nursing as an applied science and to integrate the knowledge of biomedical, human and social sciences. To identify a basic conceptual framework to describe organs and systems of a healthy and ill person from the anatomical, physiological, pathophysiological and clinical point of view. To be able to use the knowledge related to mental processes and characteristics, influence of social and cultural environment as well as the spirituality, faith and worldview of healthy and ill individuals.

To find connections among individual disciplines and draw conclusions in the context of nursing care. To be able to explain legal and ethical norms necessary for performance of the nursing profession.

To identify and solve specific problems in nursing practice, based on conceptual, analytical-synthetic, clinical and critical thinking. To use general and specialised knowledge for solving specific problems related to the profession and apply procedures, methods and resources in accordance with the standards and norms of the profession.

Through the method of nursing and education process maintain and promote optimal health condition of individuals, families and communities in the life situations requiring a complex nursing care and make them participate actively in the process of health maintenance and promotion, disease prevention as well as treatment and care during illness and dying.

To continually develop clinical and communication skills and be able to incorporate into health-care teams actively and effectively.

To analyse and solve ethical problems at the level of theoretical base of the field of study. To be bearers of humanist principles, develop the ability to empathize, respect human dignity and rights and follow the principles of nursing ethics.

To speak one world language at the basic level.

To demonstrate independence when solving specific problems regarding assessing patients' needs and planning as well as providing and documenting of nursing care.

To perform single nursing interventions in the scope of defined competencies and in accordance with the standards. To demonstrate autonomy and responsibility in taking decisions and providing a preventive, supportive, medical and rehabilitation care to individuals, families and communities through the method of nursing and education process.

To be able to work in teams.

To be able to maintain and promote an optimal health condition of individuals, families and communities in various life situations.

To present their own attitudes supported by creative, flexible and critical thinking properly and professionally

To master the basics of scientific work and the ways of obtaining scientific and specialised information.

To enter the clinical practice as devoted advocates of independence in the profession and new trends in nursing care provision. To contribute to professionalism of nursing and participate in enhancing the prestige and status of nurses in the society.
