Graduates of Nursing Education Program are capable to meet the requirements of the nursing science that integrates scientific knowledge of nursing with scientific findings of other disciplines, which are necessary for providing health-care services to the public in the form of primary, secondary and tertiary prevention.

The goal of JFMED is to provide the graduates of Master of Science in Nursing Program with following knowledge, capabilities and competencies:

To possess the complex specialised expertise in the field of study and be able to use it in argumentation.

To evaluate relevant context and principles between nursing science and health-care management, biomedicine sciences, social and human sciences, possess the knowledge acquired through the critical analysis and comparison and transform it into a holistic approach. To apply the acquired knowledge in various areas of nursing practice.

To be able to evaluate relevant procedures and methods of solving theoretical and practical problems of nursing practice. To justify and use the selected conceptual and categorial framework. To know and follow the legislation necessary for the performance of nursing profession.

To identify, propose and evaluate solutions of methodical, specialised, legal, ethical and managerial problems in various areas of the discipline.

To be able to manage nursing care in various facilities of ambulatory and institutional care. To participate in and actively lead a nursing team.

To use analytical abilities and intellectual skills for identification and critical reflexion of current nursing problems and search the possibilities for their solution. To promote transmission of scientific findings into practice and to provide evidence-based nursing care.

To be able to analyse and solve ethical problems at the level of the theoretical base of the field of study. To be a bearer of humanistic principles, develop the ability to empathize, respect human dignity and rights and follow the principles of nursing ethics.

To be independent, initiative and responsible for managing the work of the team, using the innovative, creative thinking and be able to present the results of their own study at the professional level. To demonstrate a high level of independence when solving nursing problems focused on promotion, maintenance or restoration of health in a variable environment.

To work effectively as a member or leader of the team.

To coordinate nursing care in medical and social facilities and apply management principles at all levels of management.

To demonstrate a high level of independence in an effective use of information technologies.

To master the means of acquiring scientific information and expertise.

To be able to present professionally and justify their own attitudes.

To be ready to implement scientifically justified work methods, procedures and techniques, carry out scientific research independently and publish its results and propose recommendations. To possess innovative thinking and be ready to present scientific knowledge and results at a professional level to the professional public.

To be ready for an interdisciplinary cooperation when solving specialised, scientific and social problems.

To enter the clinical practice as devoted advocates of independence in the profession and new trends in nursing care provision. To contribute to professionalism of nursing and participate in enhancing the prestige and status of nurses in the society.

To gain motivation for further personal and professional growth through a lifelong education.
