Check in the course of practicals.

1. **Evaluation till the end of 14th week:** active participation in practicals; permanent study check (control question), examination of patients, case reports and analysis, test – minimal success 60 %; Rating: A/1 = 91 – 100 %; B/1,5 = 81 – 90 %; C/2 = 73 – 80 %; D/2,5 = 66 – 72 %; E/3 = 60 – 65 %, Fx = less than 60 %

Final evaluation: evaluation during practicals = 20%; oral or test exam = 80%

Requirements to apply for exam.

1. The participation in practicals is compulsory **6 times** according to timetable.
2. The participation in lectures is compulsory **4 times** according to timetable.
3. Favourable results during running controls.
4. Favourable results in test

Examination: oral exam or test exam (according to the epidemiological situation)

Teaching of practicals will be delivered on a face-to-face basis, adhering to the anti-epidemic measures.

Teachers and students are required to wear facemasks in classes, regularly wash their hands and comply with social distancing rules. Lectures will be on line.

The teaching of practicals must take into account the specifics of the medical branch psychiatry.

Teaching will be focused on contact and communication with patients in individual and group form,

in the form of ward round with subsequent analysis of cases and presentation of model situations in psychiatry.
